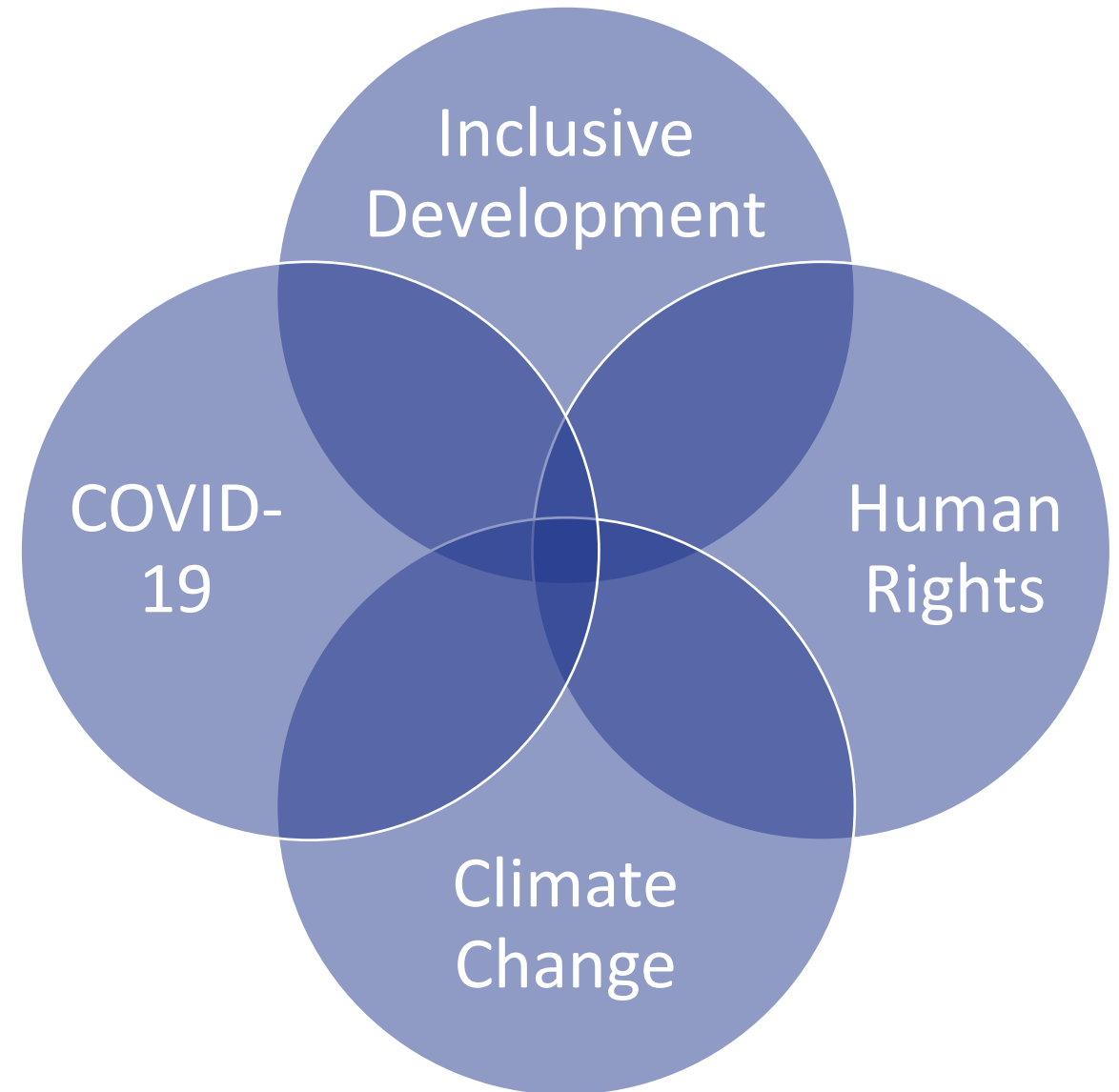

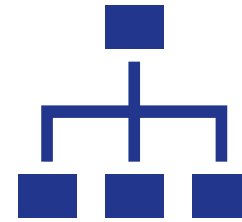
# Why is it relevant?

- Leverage expertise, experience, resources, decision making power, relationships

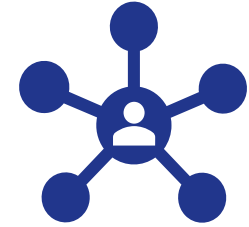


# Why is it not relevant?

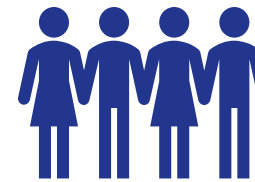
- Not always efficient
